REVELATION Lesson 7 **"The Lamb Receives the Scroll"**

I. The Book of the Seven Seals (5:1-5)

Chapter 5 is a continuation of chapter four's introduction of the second vision, the vision of the scroll. When John was first drawn up to heaven, he saw the glorious throne of God. His attention was diverted for a while to what he saw around the throne:

1. The elders

2. The glassy sea

3. The four living creatures

After John hears the 4 living creatures and the 24 elders sing their song of praise, John turns back to the throne itself and notices something.....
