Background

- The LORD himself and two angels appeared to Abraham when he was ninety-nine and promised him and his wife Sarah (89 yrs. old) they would have a Son within a year.
- ➤ God destroyed the hometown of Abraham's nephew Lot with burning sulfur. Lot's wife disobeyed God and looked back and became a pillar of salt.
- Abraham settled in a city called Gerar and lied to the king there, telling him Sarah was his sister (the same lie he told to Pharaoh in Egypt)

Read 21:1-7

- 1) In verse 1 it says, "The LORD was gracious to Sarah." Grace is undeserved love. How had the LORD shown grace to Sarah?
- 2) How long had Abraham waited for the Lord to keep his promise?
- 3) How did Abraham show his thankfulness to God and love for him?
- 4) In praising God for his grace, how did Sarah play on her son's name?

Read 21:8-10

1) God had forbidden polygamy at the Garden of Eden when he designed marriage saying, "the two shall become one flesh." Yet Abraham had children through both Sarah and Hagar. What impact does polygamy usually have on a family? In what ways do you see that here?

Read 21:11-13

1) God gave Abraham the "green light" to agree to Sarah's plan to send Hagar and Ishmael packing. This would benefit each member of the household in certain ways. Take a few minutes with the
