Some might ask, "What is it about a congregation in Georgia that would take you away from here? We've experienced tremendous growth in the past few years. You just confirmed 5 adults on Sunday. We have a beautiful new building. Things are good at Faith!" Let me add a few more questions: Why would you leave friends and family, take a cut in your salary, and try to sell a home in a housing market that will be flooded with homes in the next few months? All valid questions. The decision to go was not based on fiscal or emotional reasons. If that were the case, I would be staying. But the decision to go is based on ministry. The congregation here in Radcliff is thriving financially. The members of the church council have demonstrated spiritual maturity and strength. The members of this congregation have taken ownership of their church. Faith in Radcliff is mission-minded and knows how to do outreach in the community. Faith Lutheran now has a vision for the future and strong leaders to take that vision forward. It seems like the perfect time to stay and enjoy all of those wonderful opportunities. On the other hand, I know that this is a good time to go, because I know that the ministry at Faith will continue with or without me. I was reminded many times these past few weeks that this is God's church, not Pastor Horn's, and God will take care of it.

I was reminded by a brother in Christ that I am not leaving anyone or anything behind. I am simply moving to another part of God's kingdom - Faith in Radcliff and Mighty Fortress in Hiram are both part of that kingdom. That's one of the wonderful blessings of membership in the Wisconsin Synod – we all walk together.
