People put in many hours of work each week. Weeknight evenings are filled with activities for children and meetings of all sorts. When the weekend rolls around, there are many activities that we want to participate in. There are sports for children, recreation for families and leisurely interests for individuals. Hours on Saturday are taken up by home improvement projects or needed maintenance. By the end of it all we are tired.

Finally it is Sunday morning, a day of rest and I get to sleep in. It is the one morning that if I don't get out of bed, my work will not call and my children will not bother me. Nothing much happens on Sunday morning so it is a good time to relax. I get so tired during the week. I need more rest and Sunday seems to be the perfect day to get it. Such a busy life! It makes you wish you could have more rest. You do! In Jesus you have the rest you truly need. The church may not have that Bible passage printed on the wall, but through the Word of God you hear, you will receive rest for your soul in Jesus. Next Sunday morning, come and get some rest with us at church. It is good for your soul.

Vicar in Mission Setting Is Assigned

WELS Board for Home Missions approved Faith Lutheran to have a vicar in Mission Setting. A vicar is a student at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary who has completed two years of seminary training. The vicar year is a hands-on ministry training year, similar to an internship.

The cost to have a vicar is subsidized because of our mission status and the majority of the cost is covered by a grant. Our congregation's financial responsibility will be \$12,000 to support the vicar program.

Let us thank God for the opportunity to participate in the training of our future pastors!

The Conference of Presidents assigned Ben Zuberbier as our vicar. He will move to Kentucky in August and spend a year with us.

His installation service will be on August 18th.

We need volunteers to help with:

- Organizing a food pantry drive
- Unloading his U-Haul Trailer
- Lending furniture for him use. (Please send a picture of items you can loan, Vicar Zuberbier will choose items he needs from the photos. Those chosen will need to be freshly cleaned, free of smoke/pet hair and available to loan for one year).

- Providing meals until he is settled
