# Faith Lutheran Member Highlight Vicar Ben Zuberbier

Q: Tell us about your family. A: I'll start with my dad, Mike (2nd from the left). He's the Administrative Pastor at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Fond du Lac, WI. Because St. Peter's is a larger congregation, they have two pastors on staff. My mom, Pam (2nd from the right), is the Cafeteria Administrator at St. Peter's Lutheran School, which is associated with St. Peter's Lutheran Church. I have two siblings who are fairly close in age to me. My brother, Luther (right-center), is 23 and is in his first year at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary where he is, like me, studying to be a pastor. He's married to Allie (left-center), who is a Kindergarten Aid at Mt. Lebanon Lutheran School in Milwaukee. My sister, Mollie (right), is 21 and is in her senior year at Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE), studying International Marketing. In August she got back from Luebeck, Germany, where she studied abroad for 11 months.

Q: Are you dating anyone special? A:Yes. I'm dating a college student from Wisconsin. Her name is Hannah.

Q: Tell us about your school. A: Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary is our Synod's school to train pastors. It's located in Mequon, WI which is just north of Milwaukee. Students at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary spend three years in the classroom studying, and one year at a congregation getting practical experience. The practical year is called the "vicar year" and is what I am currently in here at Faith. I've already studied two years in the classroom, and after this year, I will be back at Seminary in the classroom for one more year before I will, God-willing, be assigned as a pastor.

Q: What is your home state? A: Wisconsin is my home state, but I lived a large part of my life in Michigan. I was born in Milwaukee, WI when my dad was at Seminary. When he graduated, he was assigned to two congregations--one in Gladwin and the other in Beaverton, MI. After living there a couple years, my dad received a divine call to Tawas City, MI. He accepted that call and I spent most of my childhood there. Tawas City is a small city on Lake Huron and somewhat of a tourist destination in Michigan. It was definitely a nice place to grow up. I lived there through most of high school. At the end of my junior year, we moved to Fond du Lac, WI, which is where I've lived since then.

Q: What are your hobbies? A: I like to fit in hunting and fishing where I'm able. I also like winter sports/ activities--snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, ice-fishing. During the summer, I usually spend time at a cabin my grandparents own on a small lake in Kiel, WI, where I can fish, ski, go boating, etc.

Q: Do you have a favorite sports team? A: I'm a cheesehead--Go Pack, Go!

Q: What do you like best about Faith Lutheran Church? A: I enjoy the family, friendly feel here at Faith. Actually, last year I remember coming here for a performance with the Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary Choir. Faith stood out in my mind as a very friendly congregation. Ever since I was installed here in August, I've felt at home.

Q: What do you like about being our Vicar? A: I enjoy all the opportunities that I have here at Faith--teaching Wednesday morning Ladies' Bible Study, teaching Adult Bible Study or Catechism class on Sunday mornings, the opportunity to preach about every other week, and actually, I like just about everything about it.


